

"Out Of The Shadows Comes Hope" is the Creation Generation challenge 3.As you can see from my logo, I do love a silhouette!

Where there is a dark side there is a light. (Yes a few Star Wars references this week) and that all seems relevant at the moment.

So this challenge has all sorts for you to choose from but all will play with the shadows and how you can use the shape created by light to make art.

From simple shadow drawing and photography to Peter Pan story telling through shadow puppets. Why not make a black paper cut out poster for your window to create sharing messages to the outside world.

As always, PLEASE send me photos of your art so I can collate the work for our community show on the other side of this. Sharing is part of our project

— its as important as the work created.

Don't be shy! All creativity is good.

And as always enjoy, especially in the promised sunshine, wherever you are Xx Natasha











Don't forget to out stretch out your hand in your photo as if you are going to hold someone's hand! This is how I will connect your image with someone else's.

WHAT MATERIALS DO YOU NEED?

- Hopefully the sun if not a torch or a light
- Pens and Pencils (especially black pens and paint)
- Tape masking tape is ideal
- Sticks
- Glue
- Cardboard
- White, Black paper and maybe coloured paper
- Thin paper or white tiddue paper
- Camera/ phone camera

We can hope!!!

But if the sun is not out
then a torch will do!














Have a go at these shadows and take some photos. Remember to avoid your shadow in the shot. Easy!









Place fun objects on white paper and draw round their shadows

I'VE GOT THIS (CONFIDENT)

Great for task for all ages. The older artists can make the shadow theatre and the younger artist can use the puppets to create a story for the little artists to enjoy. (be nice to see some videos of this — if you can share)

Make your own shadow theatre from a box, thin paper and a lamp.

Create your own story or real tell a favourite of yours.


Simple shapes or complicated cut out – its depends on the time and skill youwant to use.











Peter Pan is the perfect story for a shadow project!

All of these shadow shapes cut-outs can be found in a google search. Print, cut out and attach to sticks.










Decide on your silhouette. I printed mine from the internet.



Cut out a character or object silhouette from your story



Tape a stick or a straw to the back of your character. Mine is actually a stick from the garden.



Find your touch




You can use a shadow puppet theatre (see next slide or just use a white wall.)



Bring your character to life by holding the puppet in front of the torch. You can make it larger and smaller by moving it closer to the touch.



MASTER OF MY ART (ADVANCED).



Hong Yi, also known as, 'Red', is an artist who focuses on the reinterpretation of everyday materials for her work through the accumulation of objects.


She create installations and paintings by experimenting with everyday objects that invite viewers to consider their habits. She plays with the connection between objects arrangement (hanging, layering, stacking, fanning). Her work often portrays contemporary figures and social issues

Personally I just think her work is fun and clever!














MASTER LEVEL
SILHOUETTE POSTERS
OF PEOPLE



Stand in the light to cast the figure's shadow. Lay down black paper (or white and colour in later.)





Draw around the figure's shadow and cut out,





Chose a background – we went with inside/outside theme. Attach black paper silhouette.



2nd method

Lay down coloured paper or card.
Cast a figure's shadow onto the paper.







Draw around the shadow. Draw around in pencil and then pen.



Paint/ink the silhouette and add your message.
